I was really quite offended by Jubran's editorializing considering the propriety of preparing undergraduate students for global citizenship. I thought the comments were inappropropriate in the context of his talk and unfounded by evidence. I thought they were particularly insensitive given the number of institutions in Florida that embrace the concept; many of our institutions are home to students who tell us that they consider themselves to be global citizens—they identify with multiple interrelated ethnic groups and nationalities, and they feel allegiance and responsibility towards these groups. They ask our institutions to prepare them to solve problems in an interconnected world. Although I found some of his talk instructive in terms of the mechanics of curriculum reform, I was utterly turned-off after these comments.
