





Because it is a less rigid format that promotes discussion and exchange of ideas.


More opportunities to share with others

I was truly looking forward to Dr. Landorf and Eric Feldman's presentation because FIU is one of those internationalization programs that really stand out. They are experts in the field, and I respect the work they've done. However, I feel as if their presentation was usurped by other participants who used the time and opportunity to discuss their specific concerns. It seemed as though the presentation was to be interactive, and Dr. Landorf and Mr. Feldman would have the opportunity to talk with all participants about their internationalization efforts, not just two participants. Missed opportunity for others. I saw this same type of behavior in other sessions--others using the time and opportunity to discuss their agenda.

The overall experience was excellent. Thank you for the opportunity. The fact that one of the two days was a Friday might have caused some attendees to leave the conference early and the sessions held that day to be less well attended.
